

General Objectives: In Everyday English 3, students learn to take part in interviews and cope in a work environment; compare people and things in depth; talk about past and present; describe past experiences in depth; discuss issues of health and welfare; talk about plans, promises, and predictions; make and carry out travel plans; discuss hypothetical situations and give advice; express hopes and regrets; discuss economic issues and report information received; and discuss vacations and vacation activities.

By the end of the course, students will be able to understand main points discussed on routine matters having to do with work, school, and leisure. They will be able to deal with situations that arise during travel where English is spoken. They will be able to produce simple, connected text on familiar topics, and describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes, and ambitions. They will be able to briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans.
